Danica Patrick on the Camping World Indy Grand Prix:

"I like going to Watkins Glen. It is a challenging course to drive, and has helped me evolve as a road course driver. I think this is going to be a very competitive race. I hope the Motorola car gets some good practice laps in and we do well in qualifying."

Danica Patrick Facts

- Patrick won her first IndyCar Series race in 2008 at the Indy Japan 300.
- This is Patrick's fourth start at Watkins Glen International.
- Patrick's best finish at Watkins Glen International was eighth in 2006.
- She finished seventh in the 2007 IndyCar Series standings.
- Patrick had four top-five and 11 top-10 finishes in her first year of driving for Andretti Green Racing, including finishes of third at Texas and Nashville, and a fifth-place finish at Mid-Ohio.
- In 2005, she won the Bombardier Learjet Rookie of the Year award after finishing 12th in the final standings, recording two top fives and seven top 10s, including a fourth in the Indianapolis 500®.
- Patrick is one of only 18 drivers in IndyCar Series history to earn three pole positions, those coming at Kansas Speedway, Kentucky Speedway and Chicagoland Speedway in her rookie season.

Marco Andretti on the Camping World Indy Grand Prix:

"Watkins Glen is a great track. It's very flowing and is a rhythm track with many different types of corners. It's a track where you have to keep your momentum up in order to do well."

Marco Andretti Facts

- This is Andretti's third IndyCar Series start at Watkins Glen. He finished fifth in 2007.
- He made one start at The Glen in 2005 in a Firestone Indy Lights car and finished second.
- Andretti led 90 laps at Richmond, the most recent IndyCar Series race, and finished ninth.
- Andretti is seventh in the IndyCar Series championship, only nine points out of fifth place.
- Andretti claimed his first career pole position in 2008 at The Milwaukee Mile.
- He has led more laps in 2008 than in 2006 and 2007 combined. His 281 laps led rank third in 2008.
- Andretti finished third at the 2008 Indianapolis 500®. He has a second-place and a third-place finish at Indianapolis in three career starts.
- In his rookie season, Andretti finished second at the 2006 Indianapolis 500 in what was the second-closest finish in the history of the event.
- He joined both his father and grandfather in earning the Indianapolis 500 Rookie of the Year honor.
- Andretti had six top-five finishes in 2007 including two second-place finishes at Michigan and Iowa.
- In 2006, Andretti became the youngest driver (19 years, five months, 14 days) at the time to win a major open-wheel race when he took the checkered flag at Infineon Raceway.
- He made six starts in the Firestone Indy Lights in 2005, collecting three victories (St. Petersburg, Indianapolis road course and Infineon Raceway), five top fives and three pole positions.

Team 7-Eleven Driver Tony Kanaan 2008 Camping World Indy Grand Prix Fact Sheet

Tony Kanaan on the Camping World Indy Grand Prix:

“The Team 7-Eleven guys are really anticipating a great race at Watkins Glen. Like the Honda Grand Prix, there will be 12 or 13 drivers fighting to get into the Firestone Fast Six qualifying session. There will be a lot of different strategies, but I’m sure the 7-Eleven car will be strong and we’ll be running up front.”

Tony Kanaan Facts

- Kanaan started on the pole position and won the most recent IndyCar Series race at Richmond.
- He has 13 career IndyCar Series victories and 14 major open-wheel racing wins in his career.
- Kanaan is in fourth place in the IndyCar Series championship, only 30 points out of third.
- This is Kanaan’s fourth start at Watkins Glen. He finished second in 2005 and fourth in 2007.
- Kanaan has led 299 laps in 2008. That is the second-highest total in the IndyCar Series.
- He has recorded a top-five finish in each of the six races he’s finished in 2008.
- He is the only driver in history to lead laps in his first seven starts in the Indianapolis 500® (2002-2008) and the only driver in history to lead laps in seven-consecutive Indianapolis 500 races.
- Kanaan won the IndyCar Series driver championship in 2004, was second in 2005 and third in 2007.
- Kanaan has 13 career IndyCar Series wins (T-3rd all-time), has led 2,419 laps (4th all-time), has led 60 races (3rd all-time) and has 61 top-five finishes (2nd all-time).
- His IndyCar Series wins have come at: Phoenix (‘03, ‘04), Texas (‘04), Nashville (‘04), Kansas (‘05), Infineon (‘05), Milwaukee (‘06, ‘07), Japan (‘07), Michigan (‘07), Kentucky (‘07), Belle Isle (‘07) and Richmond (‘08).

Formula Dream Driver Hideki Mutoh 2008 Camping World Indy Grand Prix Fact Sheet

Hideki Mutoh on the Camping World Indy Grand Prix:

“I’ve raced twice at Watkins Glen International in the Firestone Indy Lights series last year, so I am excited to go back there and race in the IndyCar Series. It’s a long course. It’s been a few months since we raced at St. Petersburg, so I am looking forward to getting back to that type of course. I hope the Formula Dream team can have another strong finish this weekend.”

Hideki Mutoh Facts

- This is Mutoh’s first career IndyCar Series start at Watkins Glen International. He finished second and sixth in his two Firestone Indy Lights starts in 2007.
- Mutoh scored a career-best finish of second at Iowa Speedway, which is the best result for a Japanese driver in IndyCar Series history.
- He has five top-10 finishes in the eight races this season and six top 10s in his nine career starts.
- Mutoh scored a seventh-place finish at the 92nd running of the Indianapolis 500 after qualifying a rookie-best ninth.
- This is Mutoh’s 10th IndyCar Series race start – nine of which have come this season with Andretti Green Racing. His debut was at Chicagoland Speedway in 2007.
- He finished second in the 2007 Firestone Indy Lights championship, earning the Lucas Oil Rookie of the Year award.
- He recorded 10 top-five finishes in Firestone Indy Lights in 2007, including victories at Indianapolis (road course) and Kentucky.
- In 2007, Mutoh tied for first among all Firestone Indy Lights drivers with 13 top-10 finishes.
