Kanaan to Start Fourth at Infineon in Team 7-Eleven Car

SONOMA, Calif. (Aug. 23, 2008) – Tony Kanaan, driver of the Team 7-Eleven car, qualified fourth for Sunday’s running of the PEAK Antifreeze & Motor Oil Indy Grand Prix with a best-lap speed of 107.493 miles per hour.

Kanaan, who has one win in 2008, was the winner of the 2005 IndyCar Series race at Infineon Raceway. This marks the 14th time in 15 road course events that Kanaan has qualified for the Firestone Fast Six Shootout.

ESPN2 will provide live coverage of Sunday’s event beginning at 5:30 p.m. (EDT). The entire IndyCar Series schedule may also be heard live on XM Satellite Radio, XM channel 145, the official home of the IndyCar Series.

Tony Kanaan, #11 Team 7-Eleven Dallara/Honda/Firestone:

“We were one change behind in the Firestone Fast Six. We tried everything and as a team we’ve come a long way. We’ve been struggling on the road courses so I’m glad to see the Team 7-Eleven car in the top four. At Infineon you don’t want to start worse than the second row.”
