Patrick Finishes 14th at Watkins Glen International

WATKINS GLEN, N.Y. (July 6, 2008) – Motorola driver Danica Patrick drove to a 14th place finish in Sunday's running of the Camping World Indy Grand Prix.

Ryan Hunter-Reay captured his first IndyCar Series win. Darren Manning, Tony Kanaan, Buddy Rice and Marco Andretti rounded out the top five.

The IndyCar Series returns to the race track on Saturday, July 12, at Nashville Superspeedway. ESPN will broadcast the race beginning at 8 p.m. (EDT). The race will also be heard on XM Satellite Radio, channel 145, the official home of the IndyCar Series.

Danica Patrick, #7 Motorola Dallara/Honda/Firestone:

"The Motorola car was strong all day. We were able to get up front after on pit strategy. Unfortunately, during the final pit stop of the day I hit a tire leaving the pit and then locked the car up which then caused me to wreck into the #9 pit. Fortunately I made no contact with anyone. I really needed the leaders to pit under green, but then another yellow came out – luck was not on my side. This is a track where it is very difficult to pass. It is disappointing because I had a fast car. Congrats to Tony and his team for getting a podium finish this weekend."

Kyle Moyer, Race Strategist, #7 Motorola Dallara/Honda/Firestone:

"Although we had some things happen during the race for the Motorola team, I think we had a pretty good day considering. Danica was fast all day and worked hard. Moving forward, we have tested in Nashville, and I think it is going to be a better race for us. The crew did a good job on the pit stops, which is very important in all races, but crucial for a road course. Good job to Tony and the 7-Eleven crew for getting the car back together and finishing third."

Andretti Finishes Fifth at The Glen in oso*fresh car

WATKINS GLEN, N.Y. (July 6, 2008) – Despite contact on the first lap, Marco Andretti was able to drive the oso*fresh car to a fifth-place finish Sunday at the Camping World Indy Grand Prix.

Ryan Hunter-Reay won his first IndyCar Series race and was followed by Darren Manning. Andretti's teammate Tony Kanaan finished third, followed by Buddy Rice in fourth.

The next race on the IndyCar Series schedule is the Firestone Indy 200 at Nashville Superspeedway. ESPN will provide live broadcast coverage of the event beginning at 8 p.m. (EDT). The race will also be heard on XM Satellite Radio, channel 145, the official home of the IndyCar Series.

Marco Andretti, #26 oso*fresh Dallara/Honda/Firestone:

"It is very tough to pass here but we were able to get around some guys on the restarts. Unfortunately two of them got called back. It's really frustrating because track position is very difficult to get here. It was a race of attrition today and that worked for us. There was a vibration in the left-rear the entire race that was caused from the contact with Dan (Wheldon) on the first lap and I'm lucky that the oso*fresh car hung on. People were all over the place, blocking like crazy on the back stretch, but we played it right today and collected some valuable points."

Eddie Jones, Race Engineer, #26 oso*fresh Dallara/Honda/Firestone:

"Marco was doing a great job today and we were stretching our fuel, hoping to pit on lap 39, which we achieved. Unfortunately the yellow came out and caught us and we couldn't stay out another lap under yellow with the fuel we had so we had to come in and take some fuel. It's a shame because we would have been further up and may have had a chance for the win today. Even so, Marco was one of the few drivers making genuine passes out there. He got a couple of guys, fought his way to fifth, and gained some good points."

Kanaan Finishes on the Podium at Watkins Glen

WATKINS GLEN, N.Y. (July 6, 2008) – Tony Kanaan, driver of the #11 Team 7-Eleven car, finished third at Sunday’s Camping World Indy Grand Prix at Watkins Glen International.

Ryan Hunter-Reay drove to his first career IndyCar Series victory and was followed by Darren Manning. Buddy Rice was fourth and Kanaan’s teammate Marco Andretti finished fifth.

IndyCar Series action returns to the track Saturday, July 12, at Nashville Superspeedway for the Firestone Indy 200. Live broadcast coverage will be provided by ESPN beginning at 8 p.m. (EDT). The race will also be heard on XM Satellite Radio, channel 145, the official home of the IndyCar Series.

Tony Kanaan, #11 Team 7-Eleven Dallara/Honda/Firestone:

“It was a weird race. Sometimes it’s good to see another face in victory lane. I’m always happy to see someone who hasn’t won a race yet win, so congratulations to Ryan (Hunter-Reay). We did all we could. I have to thank the Team 7-Eleven guys for putting my car back together after the suspension failure in warm-up. My wrist kind of gave up on me a little bit. I’m in a lot of pain right now but I’ll be fine. It’s good to be in pain on the podium. We took what we got and it was good for the championship so we are getting closer now.”

George Klotz, Race Strategist, #11 Team 7-Eleven Dallara/Honda/Firestone:

“It was a good result for the Team 7-Eleven guys today. We crashed a car in the morning warmup and the whole team worked tremendously hard to get the thing put back together, not just the 7-Eleven guys. It was a good, smart day for Tony. We needed to finish at least third today and we made up some huge points on the guys that are in front of us in the championship so we’re pretty happy.”
