Helio Castroneves won the race and was followed by 2008 IndyCar Series champion Scott Dixon. Ryan Briscoe finished third, Team 7-Eleven driver Tony Kanaan finished fourth.

Other highlighted races on the 2009 schedule include the inaugural IndyCar Series event on the Streets of Toronto on Sunday, July 12, and the season finale at Homestead-Miami Speedway on Sunday, Oct. 11.

Danica Patrick, #7 Motorola Dallara/Honda/Firestone:

"I am really disappointed with my result because the Motorola car was much better than a ninth place car. We took a gamble on our strategy and got burned by the yellow. We certainly wanted to end the season on a better note."

Andretti Drives to Eighth-Place Finish in NYSE Car

JOLIET, Ill. (Sept. 7, 2008) – Marco Andretti concluded the 2008 IndyCar Series season with an eighth-place finish in the NYSE car at Chicagoland Speedway.

Helio Castroneves won the race by 0.0033 of a second over Scott Dixon who claimed the 2008 IndyCar Series championship, the second of his career. Ryan Briscoe finished third and Team 7-Eleven driver Tony Kanaan finished fourth.

The 2009 IndyCar Series season begins Sunday, April 5, 2009, with the Honda Grand Prix of St. Petersburg. The 93rd running of the Indianapolis 500 is scheduled for Sunday, May 24. Other highlighted races on the 2009 schedule include the inaugural IndyCar Series event on the Streets of Toronto on Sunday, July 12, and the season finale at Homestead-Miami Speedway on Sunday, Oct. 11.

Marco Andretti, #26 NYSE Dallara/Honda/Firestone:

“We were able to take advantage of the cold tires on the restart and gain some positions at the end of the race. Unfortunately this was another character builder for us. We struggled with the car all weekend. To be able to finish in eighth, after the day we had, was a pretty good finish for the NYSE boys.”

- Andretti finished the season in seventh place in the IndyCar Series championship.
- Andretti’s teammate Hideki Mutoh won the 2008 IndyCar Series rookie of the year award.
