TEMPORARY STREET CIRCUIT – SURFERS PARADISE, AUSTRALIA
2008 INDYCAR SERIES SEASON - ROUND #18**

Oriol Servia finished ninth in his inaugural IndyCar Series season with 358 points, just 21 points out of sixth place. Servia scored seven top-10 finishes (five on road/street circuits) including five top-five showings (season high fourth at Detroit and fifth's at Long Beach, Richmond, Mid-Ohio and Edmonton). Servia was the best of the drivers transitioning from Champ Car to the IndyCar Series this year, especially on ovals. He tied for the best finish on an oval of any transition driver, fifth in Richmond, and had the best finish of the transition drivers on five of the ten ovals, Homestead, Indy, Milwaukee, Richmond and Kentucky.

*This is Servia's ninth season (eight in Champ Car - 2000-2007) and first in the IndyCar Series.

*Servia is not considered an IndyCar Series rookie because of his extensive oval experience.

*Servia is competing for KV Racing Technology for his second full season. He previously ran for the team (then PKV Racing) for the full season in 2006 and for two races in 2007.

*The Nikon Indy 300 will be Servia's 143rd career start, 107th on a road/street circuit, 34th for the team, 18th in the IndyCar Series.

*This will be Servia's ninth start at Surfers Paradise. In the eight previous races at Surfers, Servia has qualified in the top-10 five times including the top-five twice and the pole in 2005. He has finished in the top-10 twice with a best finish of fifth in 2005.

*The Nikon Indy 300 will be the seventh time this season, sixth with all the IndyCar drivers, that Servia will be contesting a race on a track he has competed on before (Homestead, St. Petersburg, Long Beach, Milwaukee, Mid-Ohio, Edmonton and Surfers Paradise. He did qualify, but did not race in Texas.

*In 142 career starts, Servia has 77 top-10 finishes including 39 top-five showings with 16 podium performances, one victory (Montreal 2005) and one pole (Surfers Paradise 2005).

*In 106 career road/street races, Servia has earned 60 top-10 finishes including 29 top-five showings with 13 podiums, one win (Montreal 2005), one pole (Australia 2005).

*Servia has made 36 oval starts earning 17 top-10 finishes including 10 top-five showings and three podiums. His best oval finishes are seconds at Milwaukee in 2003 and Las Vegas in 2005.

*Servia has placed in the top-10 in the championship standings in five of the past six seasons with a career high second place showing in 2005 (three races with Dale Coyne Racing and 11 with Newman/Haas Racing).

*Servia is the 1999 Indy Lights Champion

*Servia was runner-up for the Jim Trueman Rookie of the Year Award in 2000

*Servia, 34, a native of Pals, Catalonia, Spain, resides in Miami, Florida.

2008 INDYCAR SERIES SEASON - ROUND #18

Will Power finished 12th in his inaugural IndyCar Series season with 331 points and third in the Bombardier Learjet Rookie of the Year race 15 points behind Hideki Mutoh, who finished 10th in the standings. He earned sixth top-10 finishes of the season (four on road/street circuits including three top-five showings (win in Long Beach, fourth in Mid-Ohio and fifth on the oval in Chicago) with one victory. Power was third highest in the standings of the drivers transitioning from Champ Car to the IndyCar Series. He tied for the best finish on an oval of any transition driver when he earned a oval career high fifth at Chicago. He had the highest oval finish of any transition driver twice in 10 oval races, the fifth in Chicago and a ninth at Iowa, and the second highest three times, Indy, Texas and Nashville.

*This is Power's fourth season (three in Champ Car - 2005-2007, two full seasons plus two races in 2005), first in the IndyCar Series and first with KV Racing Technology.

*The Nikon Indy 300 will be Power's 48th career start, 37th on a road/street course, 18th in the IndyCar Series, 18th with KV Racing Technology.

*This will be Power's third start at Surfers Paradise. In both his two previous races at Surfers, Power has qualified on pole.

*The Nikon Indy 300 will be the fourth time this season, third with all the IndyCar drivers, that Power will be contesting a race on a track he has competed on before (Long Beach, Milwaukee Edmonton and Surfers Paradise).

*In 47 career starts Power has 25 top-10 finishes including 14 top-five showings with seven podium performances, three victories and six poles.

*In 36 previous starts on road/street circuits, Power has earned 23 top-10 finishes including all 13 of his career top-five showings, all seven podium performances, all three of his career victories (Las Vegas and Toronto in 2007, Long Beach in 2008) and all six of his career poles.

*In 11 oval starts, Power has two top-10 finishes including one top-5 (fifth at Chicago this year). 10 of his 11 oval starts have come this year. He made his oval debut in 2006 at Milwaukee qualifying fifth and finishing 11th.

*Power has finished in the top-six in the championship in each of his two of his three full seasons placing sixth in 2006 and fourth in 2007.

*Power was Rookie of the Year and won the Bridgestone Passion for Excellence Award in 2006.

*Power, 27, a native of Toowoomba, Australia, resides in Indianapolis, Indiana.
